The Necklace by Guy de Maupassant is the universal story to analyse the basic nature of the human beings. The description has the beauty of the world, the dialogues and of the calculated movement. Madame Mathilde Loisel is not happy with her measurable conditions around and with the poor husband who is only a clerk in the Ministry of Education. The lady has the extra charm on her face and for her poor condition, she all the time curse the fate and destiny. She dislikes the dirty walls, the old chairs, the torn curtains and all the time thinks of the aristocratic atmosphere with all the decorated halls, the obedient slaves and the wealthy service. She does not live with her self. She is busy in her dignified dreams and curse the husband for his status.

Mr. Loisel is lucky to manage a pass for the party at the Ministry of Education. Madame Loisel is not existed because she has not proper dress or ornaments to make her presentable. She gets

four hundred francs that was
 being save by the husband for
 the hunting rifle. She adds to
 her beauty in the black gown.
 But is grieved to see the empty
 neck. The husband advises her to
 take the flowers but without
 effect. later, he reminds her of
 her Aristocratic friend, Madame
 forestier or Jennie. The friend is
 happy to lend her the beautiful
 diamond necklace that turns her
 to a princess. She is in heaven
 all through the party as every
 glorious character dances with
 her and praises her without any
 reservation. The husband during
 the period is his waiting in the
 neighboring room for the party
 to be over. At four in the
 morning, Madame Loisel is back to
 reality while moving towards home
 in an old cab. Throughout the
 journey she had been comparing
 the past with the present.
 Reaching home Madame Loisel is
 shocked to see the empty
 neck and their is the serious
 search for the lost necklace for
 the rest of the night.

Life is different now.
 On demand, Madame Loisel makes
 an excuse of the crepe being

broken within three days the couple find forty thousand franc but jeweller ready to sell thirty six thousand franc. Money is collected borrowed for every source on third day Jennie is unhappy with delay. The couple ~~move~~ to the Slum and does the work more than regular. The result is the rigid face and rough hands. Ten years later the sudden meeting bet' Loisel and Jennie presents the jerk and the shock because the first diamond necklace was artific with the simple cost of five hundred francs. The irony in the story is that the only asset of the madame Loisel, the beauty is sacrificed for the loss of a fake necklace. The story elaborates the silent evil of greed more dangerously in the lives of the couple. It is the absence of the compromise that results into the essential tragedy.
